STATEMENT OF PUBLICATION ETHICS

PRABHA is a refereed journal published by DAV P.G. College, Varanasi. To maintain fair practice in DAV P.G. College publication, we strongly believe in following practices. Success in the regarding can be achieved if these ethics practiced by following participants: authors, editors and referees –

DUTIES OF EDITORS

- The Editor – In-Chief, Managing Editor and Editor of PRABHA are responsible for deciding which of the articles accepted for publication after undergoing review should be published. The Editor-In-chief, Managing Editor and Editor may be guided by the policies of the journal's Editorial Board and subjected to such legal requirements regarding libel, copyright infringement and plagiarism. However, neither the Editor-In-Chief nor the Managing Editor have the authority to influence the referees who are conducting the review of the articles submitted for peer review.

- Manuscripts shall be evaluated solely on their intellectual merit without regard to author's race, gender, sexual orientation, religious beliefs, ethnic origin, citizenship, or political philosophy.
- The Editor-In-Chief, the Managing Editor and any editorial staff must not disclose any information about a submitted manuscript to anyone other than the corresponding author, referees, potential referees, other editorial advisers, and the publisher.
- Unpublished materials disclosed in submitted manuscript must not be used by anyone who has view of the manuscript (while handling it) in his or her own research without the express written consent of the author.

DUTIES OF REFEREES

- The referees don't know the author's identity, an any identifying information will be stripped from the document before review. Referees comments to the editors are confidential and before passing on to the author will be made anonymous.
- Any selected referee who feels unqualified to review the assigned manuscript or unable to provide a prompt review should notify the Editor-In-Chief and the Managing Editor and excuse himself/herself from the review process.
- Manuscripts received for review must be treated as confidential documents. They must not be shown to, or discussed with, others expect as authorized by the Editor-In-Chief and the Managing Editor.
- Reviews should be conducted objectively. There shall be no personal criticism of the author. Reviewers should express their views clearly with supporting arguments.
- Reviewers should identify relevant published work that has not been cited by the authors. Any statement that had been previously reported elsewhere should be accompanied by the relevant citation. A reviewer

should also call to the Editor-In-Chief/Managing Editor's attention any substantial similarity or overlap between the manuscript under consideration and any other published paper of which they have personal knowledge.

DUTIES OF AUTHORS

- Authors of reports of original research should present an accurate account of the work performed as well as an objective discussion of its significance. Underlying data should be represented accurately in the paper. A paper should contain sufficient details and references to permit others to replicate the work. Fraudulent or knowingly inaccurate statements constitute unethical behaviour and are unacceptable.
- Authors may be asked to provide the raw data in connection with a paper for editorial review, and should be prepared to provide public access to such, if practicable, and should in any event, be prepared to retain such data a reasonable time after publication.
- Authors should ensure that they have written entirely original works, and if the authors have used the work and/or words of other, this must be appropriately cited or quoted.
- An author should not in general publish manuscripts describing essentially the same research in more than one journal or primary publication. Submitting the same manuscript to more than one journal concurrently constitutes unethical publishing behaviour and is unacceptable.
- Proper acknowledge of work of others must always be given. Authors should cite publications that have been influential in determining the nature of the reported work.
- When an author discovers a significant error or inaccuracy in his/her own published work, it is the author's obligation to promptly notify the Editor-

In-Chief /Managing Editor and cooperate with the editors to retract or correct eh paper.
